

CLIENT #3 – Care limited to only 10 days

Diagnosis:

[CLIENT] is diagnosed with Opiate use disorder, Severe; Stimulant use disorder, Severe; Sedative hypnotic or anxiolytic use disorder, Severe; Cannabis use disorder, Severe; Generalized Anxiety Disorder; Obsessive Compulsive Disorder

Client is a 33 year old female who admitted on XX/XX/2015 with last date of use of XX/XX/2015 [DATE OF ADMISSION] of heroin and methamphetamine. Has a history of blackouts and seizures. Was living in a home part-time where roommate used and house was unsanitary and part-time homeless living on the streets. Father and sister have a history of mental health problems (*OCD, depression and anxiety*). Was using heroin for 2 years and meth for 12 years among other narcotics such as spice, klonopin, Norco's, Roxicodone, MDMA, Cocaine, Crack cocaine, and marijuana. Client has only had two previous treatments with a total of 15 days between the two, both resulting in relapse. Client also presents with OCD and picking of the skin and clothes. Relationship with Mother and Father is considered "tumultuous, fragmented" and "slightly absent". Client also stated that there was domestic violence in the home between her, her mother, sister and step-mother. She has also suffered from physical and emotional abuse as a child.

Insurance only authorized 10 days of residential treatment with a drop to routine out-patient as they felt the client could handle her issues at a low level of care. Insurance also denied additional care because the client chose not to use substances for detox or her cravings, with the chance of becoming addicted to another substance, client chose to develop the coping skills necessary to stay sober. They also **denied because she did not exhibit any suicidal or homicidal ideation.**



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
